

RoundtableRx - Minnesota's Medication Matchmaker



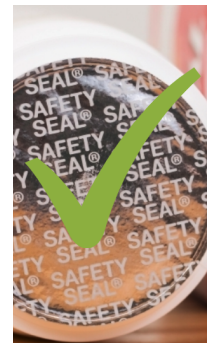
Do you have unopened bottles of medication that you or a loved one did not need?

Minnesota now has a donation program for unused medications. RoundtableRx accepts new (unopened) packages of medications that are still within their expiration date and redistributes them to patients in need.

Frequently Asked Questions

What can I donate?

- Prescription only medications
- New, unopened medications in original manufacturer packaging (pills, inhalers, etc.)
- Medications that were bubble packed by a licensed pharmacy
- Products with expiration dates of 6 months or greater
- New, unopened medical supplies (insulin pumps, etc.)



What cannot be donated?

- Over-the-counter medications and supplements
- Opened, used or compromised medications
- Medications in amber vials
- Medication bubble packs with more than one medication per bubble
- Expired medications, or medications that expire in less than 6 months
- Used, opened or compromised medical supplies
- Medications requiring refrigeration
- Controlled substances



How do I get my donations to you?

Send an email to info@roundtableRx.org to set up an appointment with one of our staff pharmacists. They will make sure the medications meet certain safety standards. If we can accept the medications, you can either drop them off at our facility in Minneapolis or mail them to us.

What happens to the medications after I donate them to RoundtableRx?

Medications donated to RoundtableRx are checked by a licensed pharmacist and redistributed to our partner clinics and pharmacies. These clinics and pharmacies then dispense the medications directly to patients in need with active prescriptions for the medication.
